We have been discussing how we can work even more closely with our school community. We recognise that strong partnerships between school, families, and the wider community make a real difference to our pupils' experiences and outcomes. We're exploring new ways to strengthen these connections and would welcome your thoughts and ideas.

We've carefully reviewed and approved the school budget for the coming year. This ensures that resources are allocated effectively to support high-quality teaching and learning experiences to the standard our pupils deserve.
